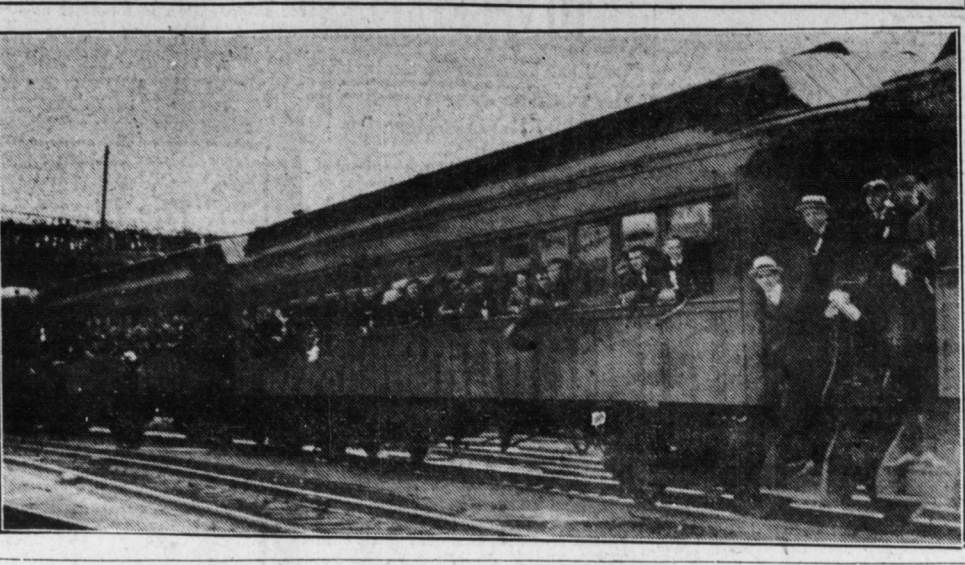

Washington, June 24.—Total casualties in the American Expeditionary force to date, numbered 8,634, according to an announcement by the War Department. They are divided as follows:

549 Names Since Sunday

The 549 names reported by General Pershing since last Sunday included 140 killed in action, 68 died of wounds, 34 died of disease, 24 died of accidents and other causes, 264 wounded in action, 4,811 missing in action, including prisoners, 365.
