HEAVY SENTENCE GIVEN SLACKER AT CAMP MEADE

Ten Years at Hard Labor For Conscientious Objector Who Ate Surreptitiously

Camp Meade, Md., June 25.—Private Jacob Rose, "conscientious objector," found guilty of trying to lead a mutiny, and of giving false testimony with regard to a hunger strike which he attempted to lead, was sentenced to ten years at hard labor by a court-martial.

Rose, one of the wildest of the radicals, according to testimony, began trying to induce Private J. Howard Branson and others to refuse to obey orders of superior officers. It was on February 1 that he sought the co-operation of Branson, Frank Buck, Alonzo Payne, Charles Felder and William M. Kantor in carrying out a hunger strike.
