Statements to this effect were made public this morning by C. W. Kaltwasser, general manager.

The priority claims of the company for a new boiler with a 510-horsepower normal rating has been satisfactorily disposed of by government officials. An A-3 rating has been secured after considerable delay and the boiler is expected in time to be installed before the winter season. This boiler, which is capable of producing 1,000-horsepower, together with the other boilers of 4,000-horsepower normal rating, will satisfactorily care for Harrisburg's steam heating needs during the winter.

The plant of the concern is being somewhat remodeled that there may be no repetition of last winter's unfortunate heat shortage. The four stokers which were installed last September and which were the cause of a large part of last winter's trouble, are being torn down and being thoroughly rebuilt. Two new double fans have been installed and two 150-horsepower turbines to drive them will soon be in position.
