Among the others interested in securing membership are H. M. Fuller Worden, who has already obtained a considerable number of signatures to applications for membership.

senerally were marking time, the Italians to-night carried out a brilliant counterattack near Pourcy, north of the Marne, after the Germans had harried them by incessant attacks during the day. They drove the enemy back into the valley of the Ardre river.

Other sectors both north and south of the river Marne saw many small local actions, but nothing partaking of the character of a general action. Numerous hard-to-hand encounters occurred.

The enemy still is trying hard to make progress toward Epernay by way of Venteuil on the north and Neuilly and Montvoison on the south of the Marne. Montvoison changed hands several times, the French eventually gaining some ground. Nowhere along the front did the Germans obtain an advantage during the day. Heavy fighting with constant attacks and counterattacks have been taking place in the vicinity of Courton wood, where, owing to the nature of the ground, the situation is most difficult.

East of Rheims the day was comparatively quiet but the French recaptured some trenches in the vicinity of Prunay and repuised attacks between Beaumont and Sillery.
