'PETE' WRITES VOICING WANTS OF 'OUR BOYS'

Letters, and Long Ones, Is the Cry From France of Harrisburg Lad

Henry F. (Pete) Ellis, formerly of 1921 First street, one of Harrisburg's first draftees, is now in France battling with the Hun...

His letter to this paper follows: I am in France with the American Expeditionary Forces. I was one of the first Harrisburg boys to be drafted and I formerly made my home at 1921 First street...

Dear Miss Fairfax: I believe the letter of Miss Beatrice Fairfax, which appeared in your paper on May 2, contains some sound advice. The letter follows: "DEAR MISS FAIRFAX: "I am 17 and have a boy friend who enlisted in the Army about three months ago...

"Also, it is proper for me to accept a box of candy, call him up on the telephone and write to him frequently when he sails for France, which he expects to do soon?"

"There certainly is nothing 'improper' about any of your suggestions, and yet these very questions seem to puzzle my numerous girls. The discipline at the army camps is splendid; there are generally numerous fine, older women officers and nurses, nurses, pressesses, members of the National League For Women Service, etc. Go to the dance, my dear, and have a happy time, giving also real enjoyment to the lady who will soon cross the sea and be cut off from home and the innocent gaieties youth needs. Of course, you may accept such gifts as candy, flowers, or a little book, or any small token your soldier can afford to send you. And every brave, sunny, friendly letter you write him will help keep up his courage and make him a better fighting man."

"When I went into camp back home the boys would never be sent over here, but we were mistaken. There will be a lot more over here who are going home."

"I believe the girl and everybody else ought to make it as pleasant as they can for these boys, because, believe me, the people back home mean to spend their money on us boys who are over here, and especially is entertainment needed when we are among the French people and do not know how to spend their money."

"Tell the people in Harrisburg when they write to their boys over here to make their letters long and to write often."

"Well, I will close with best wishes to the people of Harrisburg and with regards to the boys of the Veteran Volunteers Firemen's Association and the boys of the Citizen Fire Company No. 3."
