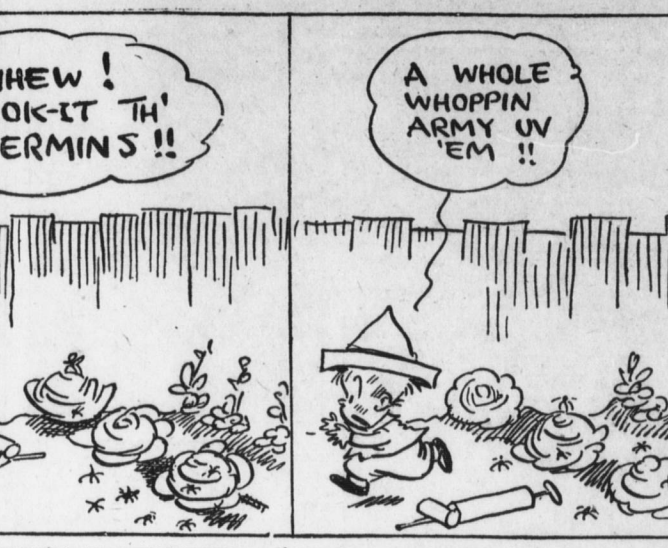

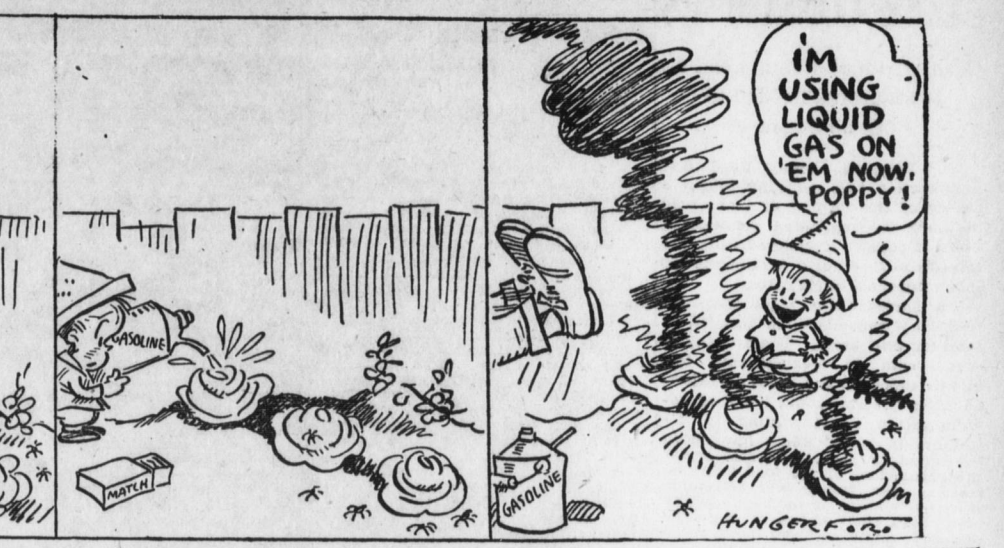
Maj. Percy D. Haughton, former Harvard football coach, has resigned as president of the Boston National League baseball club. His successor has not been named.
