Escorted to Island The militiamen marched to the Island from their armory escorted by Companies A and B of the Harrisburg Reserves, commanded by Captains F. H. Hoy, Jr. and L. V. The escorting Reserves marched down the field and then across to Major Stine where they again presented arms and the color guard went to the center of the battalion formation, the escorting company marching to its place in the line. The bugler then sounded "The Colors" and the battalion was presented to Major Stine who had it pass the visiting officers in review.

After the review, which was given on the double quick to the pleasure of the audience, Captain Harn's company gave an exhibition drill and then had a company song. The Reserves held forth in another part of the field going through drill drills and being given some stiff training by Captain Hartman in various formations.
