Dutch Ships Will Bring Sugar to United States

Washington, Aug. 16.—Forty Dutch ships, totaling approximately 100,000 tons, now idle in Dutch East Indian ports, are expected to be released to bring sugar, tin, quinine and other commodities to the United States.

Tonnage placed at the disposal of the American government through the agreement will be sufficient, it was estimated yesterday, to import from 50,000 to 100,000 tons of sugar and also much needed quantities of tin and quinine.

American Engineers Are at Vladivostok

Vladivostok, Sunday, Aug. 16.—Eighty-four members of the Stevens Railroad Commission, sent from the United States to Russia in May, 1917, to assist in the rehabilitation of the Russian railroads, and who have been at Nagasaki for the past eight months, have arrived here. They will begin work on the Siberian railroad behind the Czechoslovak lines between this city and Knabovorsk.

Aurora Borealis Affects Telegraph Wire Service

New York, Aug. 16.—Telegraph wire service in a large area in the east and west was hampered last night by the electrical phenomenon known as the aurora borealis, or "northern light."
First Vice President G. W. E. Atkins, of the Western Union Company, said cable and land lines were affected, especially in New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Maine, service being intermittently interrupted.

Stock Exchange Gets Ready For Fourth Loan

New York, Aug. 16.—The Stock Exchange announced today that it had sold all its non-taxable 3 1/2 per cent. Liberty Bonds in order to subscribe to the next Liberty Loan. This step was taken by the governors of the exchange as an example to other institutions, corporations and individuals to take similar action and reinvest in taxable war bonds. The amount of the 3 1/2s sold by the Exchange was not disclosed.
