Liberty 3 1/2 Ascend to New High Record of 101.19 in Wall Street

New York, Aug. 20.—Noon trading assumed wider proportions later, the usual leaders, however, being obscured by rails and specialties. Wisconsin Central was prominent among the low priced rails, advancing 1 1/2 points. Union Pacific and St. Paul pfd. gained one point each. General Motors was again active despite recent restrictions, advancing 3/4 and gains of 1 to 3 1/2 points were recorded by American Telephone, American Can, Steel Foundries, Railway Steel Spring and Baldwin Locomotive. Liberty 3 1/2 was lifted to the new high record of 101.19, related issues showing greater steadiness.
