Commander Sinking Tanker Recently Recognized in New York Saloon
Washington, Aug. 20.—Officers and crews of German submarines operating off the American coast are believed to be coming ashore and visiting New York and other cities.

160 U-boats Operating
An unofficial estimate, obtained yesterday, credited Germany with now having in operation approximately 160 submarines, although the total may be as high as 180.
