## TROLLEY LINE WAS NEGLECTED

Charges of Gross Mismanagement Made at Hearing in Railway Receiver Case

Carlisle, Pa., Sept. 7.—Charges of gross mismanagement were made at the second hearing in the applications of representatives and bondholders of the Cumberland Railway Company for the appointment of a receiver for the property. The hearing, which was held until a late hour yesterday, was adjourned until next week when Samuel A. Kitzmiller, of Shippensburg, the president, could attend, it being brought out that his testimony was essential on several features of the work. It developed by the examination of George A. Plough, general manager and treasurer, that more than \$240-000 of the bonds of the company were held in Pennsylvania. It was also contended by the complainants that the company owes between \$10,000 and \$20,000 in back taxes to the statements for the Auditor General's office and that two of the officers, according to Plough, swore to them with little investigation. Plough involved the president of the line in a number of the angles of the business.






