

U.S. REFUGEES FROM RUSSIA AT SWEDE CAPITAL

Sheldon Whitehouse, American Charge d'Affaires, Meets Countrymen

Stockholm, Sept. 8.—The American refugees from Moscow have reached Stockholm, twelve days after their departure from the Bolshevik capital.

When the Americans left Russia they say flour sold at a dollar and twenty-five cents a pound, and that it was seldom obtainable at any price.

The refugees say that starvation had become so prevalent in Moscow that the government was forced to remove all regulations on citizens and permitted them to enter the city with sixty pounds of food each.

Following an attack on the British consulate at Petrograd on August 31, in which Captain Cromie, the British attaché, was killed, the British government demanded immediate reparation.
