

He says, 'Airange thy' affairs, if possible, so that thou can leisurely devote two or three hours every day or so not merely to devo-tional exercises, but to the very act of secret prayer and communion with God. Endeavor seven times a day to withdraw from business and company and lift up thy soul to God in pri-sing after midnight and devoting some time amid the silence and dark-ness of the night to this sacred work.
