METZ, IMPORTANT GERMAN BASE OF WEST, IN PERIL

City of 60,000 Lays Astride Moselle and Seille Rivers; Fort Important

ations toward Metz strike at one of the most important German bases in the west. The city and the twenty-eight encircling forts comprise what has been regarded as one of the most formidable fortresses in the world. Metz also is the center of important iron fields, which before the war supplied France and Germany with more than two-thirds of the ore used by their iron manufactories. Metz is on the Moselle, ten and a half miles west of the French border. The city lays astride the Moselle river as well as on both sides of the Seille. Part of the city is on islands in the Moselle. To the east, north and northwest are the iron and coal fields of French and German Lorraine. Deprived of these fields, Germany could not conduct the war another three months, it is asserted.
