New York, Oct. 10.—Wall Street trading in the first half hour of today's stock market was characterized by extreme irregularity, the war division again reacting, while shipping, utilities and oils resumed their activity at material gains.

Minimum quotations for the current movement were made by active war equipments during the further irregular trading of the morning. Declines in stocks were accompanied by heaviness in leathers, copper and distilling issues.

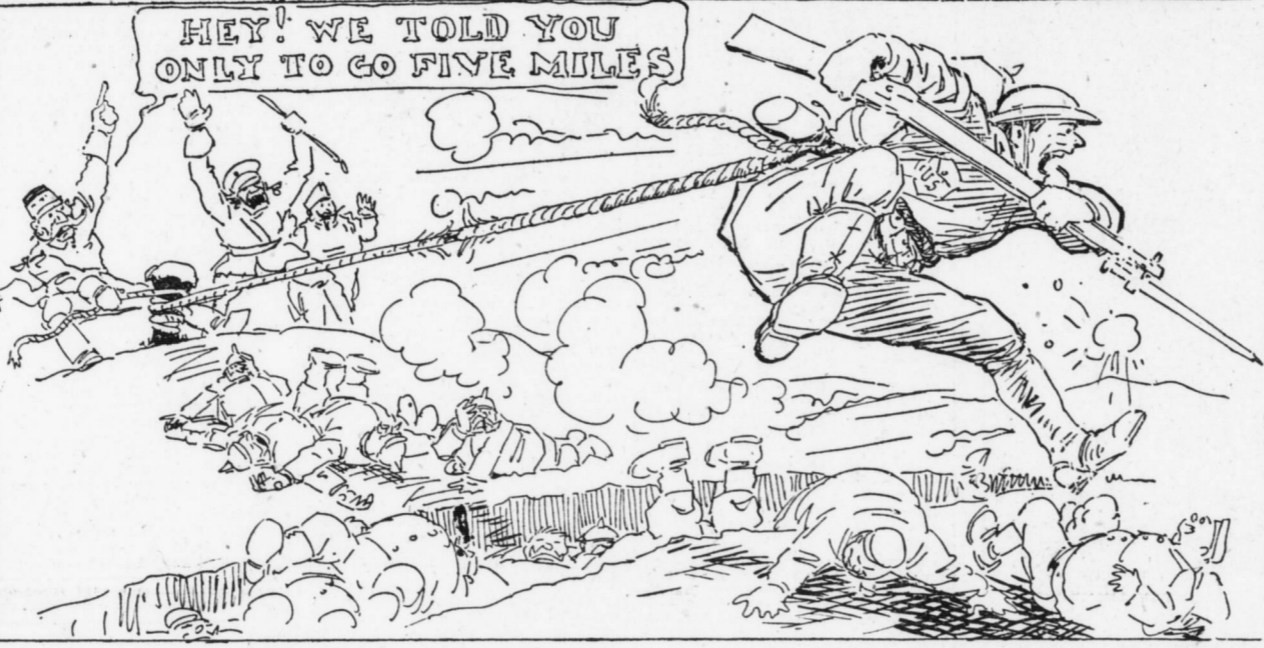
