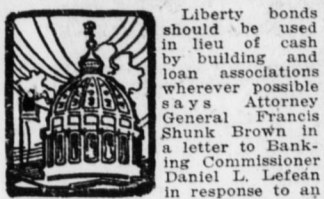

SCORE OF STATE SOLDIERS LISTED IN CASUALTIES

702 Names on List Reported to War Department from Battle Fronts

Washington, Oct. 12.—The casualty lists given out by the War Department today contain 702 names, 137 of which were killed in action. Twenty Pennsylvanians figure in the fatalities. Seven citations for bravery carrying distinguished service crosses were awarded to Pennsylvania soldiers.

RED CROSS IS AIDING DOCTORS HOSPITAL FOR GRIP VICTIMS

No Let Up in Number of New Cases of Influenza Reported

The official personnel of the staff of the new Emergency Hospital at Cottage Hill was announced this morning. It is headed by Captain R. C. Battle, who has complete command of the temporary institution. Dr. W. J. Middleton is chief of the staff of physicians.

Hereafter, it is announced, all prospective hospital patients will first have to undergo an official diagnosis of their cases by physicians before they will be permitted to enter the hospital. Such a ruling has been found imperative owing to the fact that many here who are suffering from minor ailments wholly outside the influenza class are seeking admittance to the institution when neither their condition nor the character of their complaints warrant their acceptance there.

Local doctors combating the scourge have asked Superintendent of Schools L. E. McGinnis to issue a call for volunteers among the teachers to help in stamping out the disease. Such teachers as respond will be put to work as nurses' aids.

Physicians here have sent out urgent requests that all professional calls on them be made as early as possible in the morning. POSTAL TAKES \$5,000

How War Ends More Important Than When It Closes, Lodge Declares

Washington, Oct. 12.—Replying to Democratic censure of his attitude on the President's note to the German government, the Republican Senator Lodge declared today:

"Am I to be criticised because I demand that Germany be forced to make reparation for her crimes in Belgium and France? There is nothing in the fourteen terms which I regard as vital to a peace settlement. Germany must be made to pay for the lives of our lost merchant ships."

"The best diplomats in France today are the armies of America, England and Italy."

"When the war ends it is not nearly so important now as how it ends. It is not the terms of the peace that we should be concerned with, but the American people want unconditional surrender and dictated peace, and I shall support it."
