FIGURES POUR IN SHOWING LOAN TO BE OVER THE TOP

Number of Bonds Purchased in Drive Thought to Be 30,000,000

Washington, Oct. 21.—Estimates and figures showing the success of the Fourth Liberty Loan poured in to the Treasury to-day, indicating that there were about 25,000,000 subscribers during the campaign which closed Saturday night and that the six billion-dollar goal was passed by several hundred millions...

Thirteen hundred clerks were at work to-day examining, counting and shipping bonds as fast as they came from the bureau of engraving and printing. They were received in huge bundles, carefully wrapped and sealed, and went to the federal reserve banks in much the same form. Although the exact number of bonds sold will not be known for many weeks, officials estimate that it exceeds thirty million. In the Third Loan slightly less than 25,000 were bought.
