Co-operation Accomplishes More Than Criticism

When the Health authorities of forty-four states report the epidemic on the wane and local conditions are almost back to normal again, a word of commendation for those who have bravely battled to overcome the dread disease is only just.

Doctors have worked night and day with little time for sleep, regularity of meals, or the physical care that is necessary to maintain the strength that resists the disease.

Red Cross members, school teachers and neighbors have volunteered as nurses and taking the chances of becoming victims in order to help the afflicted.

Business houses that were permitted to remain open have voluntarily refrained from special sales, or other methods that would draw crowds; and those obliged to close have, with few exceptions, complied with a forbearance that is admirable.

No one is so competent to judge conditions and best methods as those in authority where reports from all sections center. Occasional mistakes are made by everyone, but it stands to reason that when methods applied are those almost universally used, the authorities in the various sections cannot all be mistaken.

Whether it is a neighborhood of two or three, or two and three million people, neighborly co-operation and immediate action is essential by those able to render service. Though local conditions have been serious, we may be thankful that prompt action and co-operation has prevented as serious conditions as have existed elsewhere.

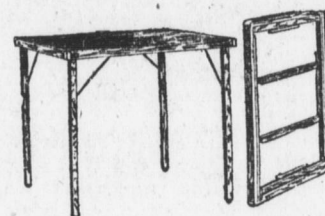

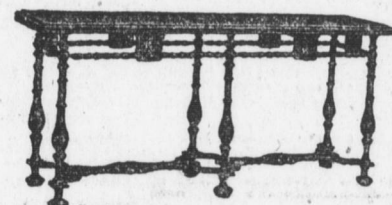

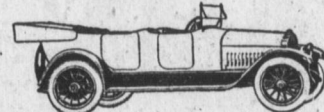
