Prison Inmates Can't Manufacture Munitions

Inmates of the penitentiaries and prisons of Pennsylvania can not be legally employed in the manufacture of supplies or munitions for the United States government because the recent act establishing the Frison Labor Commission and regulating employment of prisoners provides that they may manufacture only for the state, the counties or public institutions, according to an opinion given to-day by Attorney General Brown to Eastern Penitentiary authorities. 
