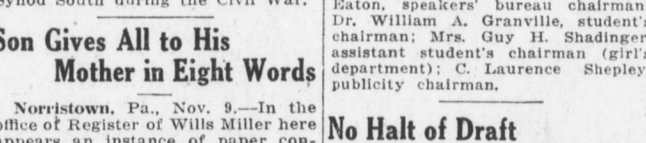

Washington, Nov. 9.—Secretary of War Baker yesterday authorized the statement that the western front armistice in France have not caused the War Department to check in any way the machinery of the draft law, and that no contracts for supplies or equipment have been cancelled because of the probability of Germany's accepting the terms received yesterday morning from Marshal Foch.
