Wheat Flour Ruling Abrogated by Peace

Wheat flour can now be purchased without accompanying percentage of substitutes. Such was the announcement last evening of Dauphin County Food Administrator McCormick.

announcement was made by Mr. McCormick upon the receipt of a telegram from Federal Administrator Hoover that this ruling had been removed. The old ruling called for the use of twenty per cent. substitutes with eighty per cent. of wheat flour.

without substitutes, it was stated by the local food administrator that the need for conservation is just as great as ever. Despite reports to the contrary, Mr. McCormick stated that the cattle survey in Dauphin county will be carried out without change.
