Ex-Kaiser's Utterances Ran Scale From Arrogance to Desperation

Prominence is given by the British newspapers to some of the utterances made by former Emperor William while the war is in progress, including the following: 1914 "Before the leaves fall from the trees we shall be back again in the dear fatherland. Exterminate first the treacherous English and walk over General French's contemptible little army. 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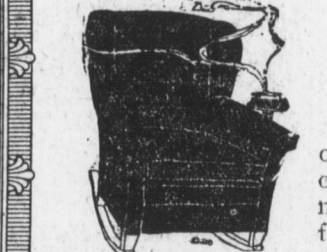
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Declares the Lowering of Wartime Wages Essential

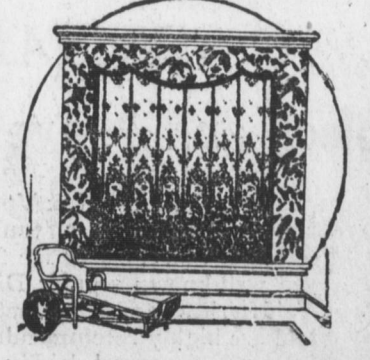
