1,399 MEN IN THE WAR CASUALTIES; 263 ARE KILLED

Thirteen Pennsylvanians Are Named in Fatalities in Battle Overseas

Washington, Nov. 20.—The two casualty lists given out by the War Department to-day contain 1,399 names, those killed in action numbering 263. Thirteen Pennsylvanians are among the latter. The summary and lists follow:

Table listing casualties: Killed in action (263), Died of wounds (145), Died of disease (145), Wounded, degree undetermined (238), Wounded slightly (318), Missing in action (94), Wounded severely (131), Died of accident and other causes (5), Prisoners (18). Total: 1,399.
