

SEAT AT PEACE TABLE POINTED OUT BY "DRYS" IN SENATE PROBE

Anti-Saloon League Sees Way of Widening World Sentiment

Columbus, Ohio, Nov. 21.—The peace conference as a means of spreading the prohibition movement into countries as yet untouched by anti-saloon forces was advocated here last night at the world-wide conference on prohibition, being held under the auspices of the Anti-Saloon League of America.

The Rev. P. A. Baker, national superintendent of the league, addressing the meeting said that "somehow prohibition sentiment must make itself felt at the peace table," but did not indicate by what means.

GERMAN ALLIANCE LINKED TO BEER IN SENATE PROBE

Un-American Organization Is Revealed as Opposing Nation's Friendliness to Allies

Washington, Nov. 21.—The program activities of the German-American Alliance, which organization it was declared, fostered movements to injure the United States and prevent munitions going to the Allies, and other un-American acts, were revealed yesterday during the continued hearing into the beer money employed in buying newspapers.

Major Humes, who is conducting the case, read a statement from the president of the German-American Alliance which seemed to be an appeal to the Germans to be loyal to the United States, but really was a protest against sending munitions to the Allies.

"I did not know any such statement was prepared in our offices," replied the witness. "Whether it would show any relations between the brewers and the German propagandists I doubt very much."

"But don't you consider it rather significant that it came from our office and was prepared there for the United States?" asked Major Humes.

"I cannot recall that, but it might have been done," replied Mr. Fox. Pressed to tell whether the United States Brewers' Association had not paid \$25,000 at one time to the German-American Alliance, Mr. Fox said it "might be true."

Going into the brewers' blacklist, Major Humes asked if the brewers' Association had not, for years, maintained a boycott against concerns that opposed the liquor interests.

"There was no boycott," replied Mr. Fox. "We were simply engaged in what was practically a warfare. We had our business at stake and we felt that we had a legitimate right to throw business to those who were friendly to us. That is why we had our list of concerns that were unfriendly."

WAR BOARD WILL MEET ON TUESDAY

Belief at Capitol That Governor Has Enough Votes to Be Chosen Historian

The State Defense Commission or "War Board," which has the disbursement of the \$2,000,000 appropriation made by the last Legislature for emergency and war activities, will meet here next Tuesday.

It is expected that William H. Ball, his secretary, will be his collaborator. The Governor is said to have assurance of a majority of the votes of the members of the commission for the selection of himself and is very ambitious to do the work.

There were intimations to-day that the Governor's project might run counter to the collection of data begun two months ago by the Pennsylvania War History Commission, which is headed by Governor-elect William C. Sprout and which includes such men as Dr. John Bach McMaster, Herman V. Ames, Hampton L. Carson, John V. Jordan and other men eminent in historical matters.
