The Christian Endeavor Society of the Sixth Street United Brethren Church will conduct a seven-day membership campaign December 1 to 8.

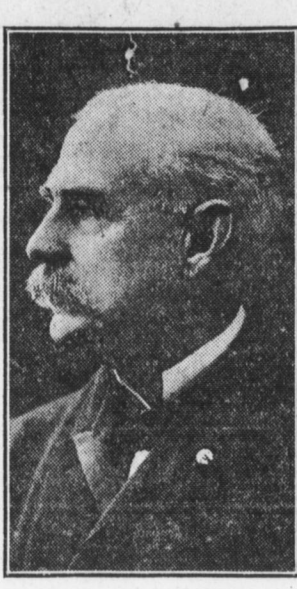
There will be a special service held Sunday, December 1, at which time a class of intermediate Christian Endeavor members will graduate into the senior Christian Endeavor Society.
