The report of the treasurer of the Board of Trustees acknowledged the receipt of the following bequests during the year: Lavina Pitt, \$95; Catharine Chandler, \$200; John A. Miller, \$50; Sarah Balsmer, \$300; a total of \$645.

The report of the treasurer of the Board of Woman Managers set forth a deficit of about \$300.

The Secretary of the Woman Managers, Miss Lydia A. Forney, announced the death of two of the guests during the year, and the admission of several others; and quite a number of applicants on the waiting list.

The home had only one case of Spanish influenza, and that a very slight one.

The following were elected officers for the coming year: President, Charles A. Kunkel; vice-presidents, Mrs. Elizabeth C. Kunkel and Mrs. J. W. Kelly; secretary, Henry C. Demming; treasurer, Harrisburg Trust Company.

FAIR VALUES IN WATER CONCERNS

Interesting Comments Made by the Public Service Commission in Decision

In fixing \$345,000 as the value of the property of the Jersey Shore Water Purification Company, operating in Jersey Shore, Lycoming county, on the application of that company for a certificate attesting the value for purposes of reorganization, the Public Service Commission makes its own estimates and comments upon practices.

The increased demand for water for the supply of pure water and the development of our state have undoubtedly necessitated large expenditures for improved supplies and facilities, but we can not subscribe to a theory which would include in our estimate of expenditures whether they were due to a lack of care in planning and development of water to a growth of the country which could not have been foreseen.

Commission Asks Law.—Authority for the State Game Commission to purchase land for the establishment of game preserves is one of the matters which will be brought to the attention of the next Legislature by the State Commission.

Sittings Fixed.—Announcement has been made by the State Compensation Board will be held in Pittsburgh December 3, 4 and 5.

Exam Dates.—Pennsylvania state examinations of applicants for certificates as druggists, chiropractors and opticians will be held in Philadelphia December 4 and 5 according to announcements here.

Dr. Munce Honored.—Dr. Thomas E. Munce, acting state veterinarian, was elected by postcard ballot to represent the second district of the American Veterinary Medical Association on the executive board.

Thirty-seven file.—Thirty-seven of the counties have filed the official returns of the election of November 5 at the State Department and owing to the delays the official count for the state will not be completed until January 1.

Speed Up Work.—Major W. G. Murdoch, chief draft officer, has issued notice to the effect that the filing of the 18-year-old registrants and calling attention to the fact that the records must be closed on December 10.

United Program.—The State Fisheries Commission, at its meeting in Philadelphia yesterday, outlined the program for the Pennsylvania and for the Beech Creek for improvement in the county.

CORN CROP FELL OFF THIS YEAR

State Reports Show That Lancaster Was Short and That Potatoes Were Low

Decreases of almost 2,000,000 bushels in the corn crop of Pennsylvania and of 6,000,000 bushels in the potato yield of 1918, as compared with the crops of 1917, but a jump of over half a million bushels in buckwheat are reported by the State Department of Agriculture in a bulletin on crops issued today.

The total corn crop amounts to 63,597,435 bushels as compared with 65,260,885 last year, while the potato crop reached a total of 24,733,242 bushels as compared with 30,653,209 a year ago.

Lancaster county again carried off the honors as the banner corn center with a total production of 522,880 bushels with York second with a production of 433,042 bushels.

Other leading counties are Franklin, 3,161,547; Berks, 2,892,547; Chester, 2,728,869 and Cumberland, 2,744,224.

Lancaster crop is almost a million bushels less than in 1917. "Lehigh county is the champion potato producer with 1,543,990 bushels.

Other leaders are York, 998,946; Lancaster, 992,550; Schuylkill, 860,940.

Other counties carry off the honors in buckwheat production with Bradford leading with 450,058 bushels and Indiana second with 411,180.

Other leaders are Crawford, 323,380; Tioga, 326,634 and Bedford, 244,944.

William B. Coover Dies

Harrisburg, Pa., Nov. 27.—William B. Coover, 68, died at his home at West Locust street on Monday night after an illness of several months of paralysis.

He was engaged in the carpenter business in Harrisburg for 25 years. He was a member of Lodge No. 302, Free and Accepted Masons and a charter member of the Cumberland Valley Castle, Knights of the Golden Rule, although not a member at the time of his death.

Mr. Coover was born in Roxbury, near this place, but lived here about forty years. He survived by his wife and two daughters, Mrs. J. W. Geiger and Miss Edith Coover, both of Mechanicburg; also two brothers, Jacob G. Coover, of this place, and John Coover, of Boiling Springs. Funeral services will be held on Thursday afternoon at 2 o'clock and burial will be made in the Mechanicburg cemetery.
