650 AMERICANS TOLL OF DEATH IN WORLD WAR

25 Pennsylvanians Killed in Action, Department Figures Show

Washington, Dec. 6.—Twenty-five Pennsylvanians were killed in action out of the 205 reported. The casualty lists to-day total 1,750 names. The summary follows:

Killed in action, 205; Died of wounds, 41; Died of accident and other causes, 5; Died of airplane accident, 3; Died of disease, 296; Wounded severely, 105; Wounded (degree undetermined), 290; Wounded slightly, 588; Missing in action, 117.
