

CONSCRIPTION IN EUROPE TO END, BRITISH DEMAND

England to Press For Surrender of the Former Kaiser

Dundee, Dec. 6.—The British representatives at the peace conference will demand general and absolute abolition of conscription throughout Europe.

Winston Spencer Churchill made this announcement in a speech here last night.

"We intend to make the Germans pay for the harm they have done to the uttermost farthing they are capable of paying," said Colonel Churchill later on in his address.

With regard to the former Kaiser, he said: "We have, so far as Great Britain is concerned, decided that so far as our influence goes, we shall demand his surrender. Stern justice must be meted out to him and his accomplices."

"We shall do our utmost to have his share in the responsibility for the unequalled catastrophe tested to the full before a tribunal of justice."

"We shall also insist that those German subjects in this country or others of German origin who have abused our hospitality and who are interned shall go back to their country when peace is signed, and, in my opinion, it would not be right until the country has again been consulted in three or four years' time that we reconsider the whole situation of allowing other Germans to come into this country from outside."

"Ton for ton of gold, or other securities, or any other liquid assets of which the Germans might dispose, we intend to exact from them, subject to the condition that in exacting them we must not do anything that will injure our own trade."

"Alsace-Lorraine must be given back to the French without any qualifications of any kind. "Poland must be reconstituted as a nation."

"None of the German colonies or Turkish provinces we have captured will be given back to Germany or Turkey. They must be disposed of in agreement with all other nations at the peace conference, in accordance with the wishes of the native populations."

"Lastly, we enter the peace conference with the absolute determination that there shall be no limitation imposed upon our right to maintain our navy, which saved us from the horror of invasion and starvation."

"It has enabled us to save the cause of freedom throughout the world, and we do not intend—no matter what arguments and appeals are addressed to us—to lend ourselves in any way to fettering restrictions which would prevent the British navy from maintaining its well-earned and its well-deserved supremacy of the seas."

Steamers Search in vain For Crews Hit by Great Lake Gale

Sault Ste Marie, Mich., Dec. 6.—Captain Leclerc, the French naval officer in charge of the French mine sweepers which left Port William, Ont., November 15, announced last night he was convinced that the Cerisoles and Inkerman, the two vessels which became separated from the fleet, had gone down in Lake Superior with their crews, numbering seventy-six men. Both vessels were equipped with wireless and were last seen off Keweenaw Point November 24.

The steamer Huronic and coast guard cutters are searching the lake for the missing boats in the hope that they may have taken refuge from recent storms in some island harbor.
