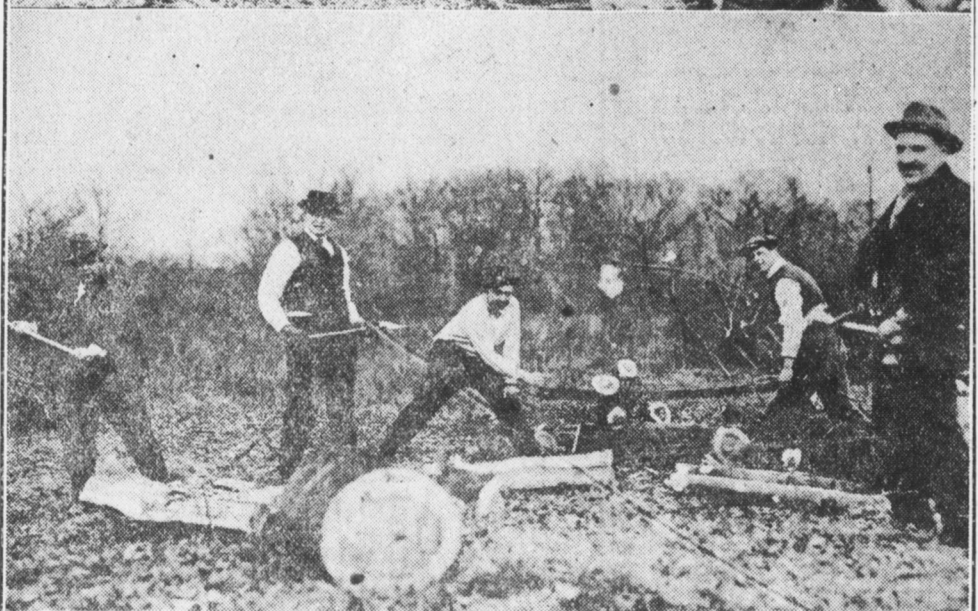
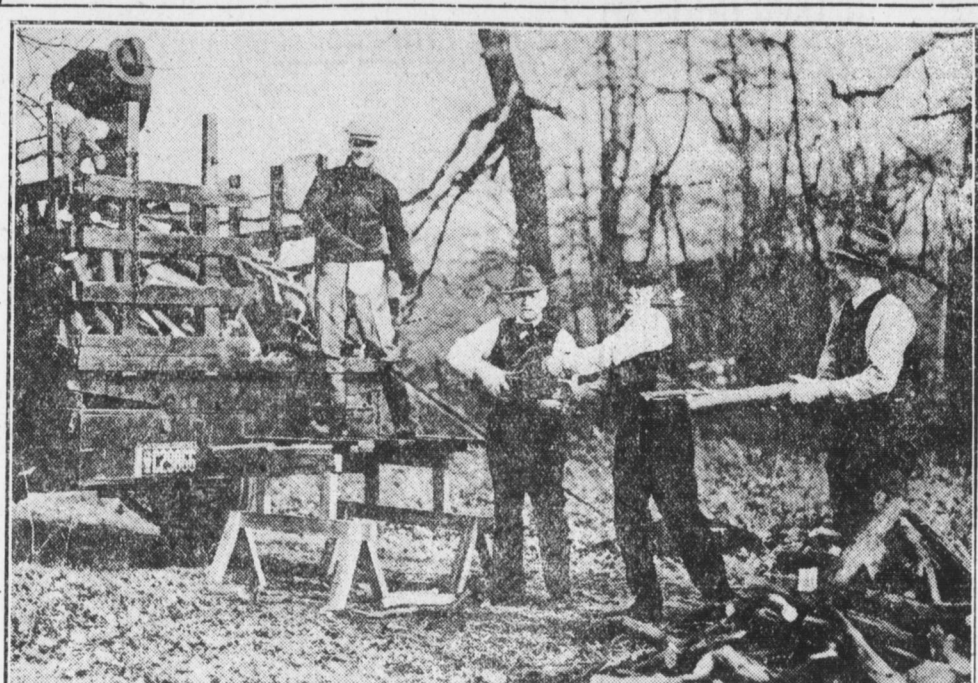

NEWS NOTES FROM NATION'S CAPITAL. Washington.—The Minnesota oil inspection law of 1909 was held constitutional to-day by the Supreme Court.

Washington.—Fuel Administrator Glavin has been asked by President Wilson to hold himself in readiness to join the peace delegation in Paris to advise concerning problems of fuel production and distribution.

Washington.—Cotton ginned prior to December 1 was 9,563,124 running bales, including 134,150 round bales; 10,170 bales of American Egyptian, 25,741 bales of Egyptian Sea Island and the Census Bureau to-day reported.

Washington.—Not a single member of the American Army has been put to death since the beginning of the war because of the commission of a purely military offense, Major General Crowder, judge advocate general, declared in an annual report to-day to Secretary Baker.
