

TWO SCORE STATE PENNA. MEN FALL IN WAR ON HUNS

3,046 Reported in Lists of Casualties Cabled by Pershing

Washington, December 9. — The number of the casualties given out by the War Department to-day are reported as wounded, forty Pennsylvanians were killed in action, out of the 21 reported. The total number of names in to-day's lists is 3,046. The summary follows:
