WAR BROADENS CHURCH VISION

It is the opinion of the War Commission that the war has broadened the view of the whole church, and that there are strong indications that it has awakened the importance of developing real Christian leadership among the men. The Rev. George Taylor, of Wilkesburg, presented the report for the Standing Committee to the Synod.

During the program, the report of the Rev. William L. Mudge, of Chambersburg, to the Synod, showed the report of the Synod of Pennsylvania, as presented by the Rev. Mr. Mudge, follows in part: "There are now the following federations in the Synod: The State Federation in this city next week. This federation has been in existence for seven years. It is composed of eleven denominational bodies. In 1916 delegates representing 683,500 communicant church members were present. Last year the number was 885,500, a gain of almost 200,000. A committee has been appointed to raise a budget of \$6,000, so as to establish a well-equipped office with a paid secretary who will give his full time to the work.

New York, Dec. 10. - The authenticity of the note sent by Dr. Alfred Zimmermann, the German foreign secretary, to the German minister to Mexico, as published in the United States in March, 1917, was admitted in dispatches from the German capital shortly after the publication of the note in this country. The subject, in fact, came up at a session of the Reichstag budget committee on March 5. The Berlin wireless dispatch which reported the debate stated that the committee expressed regrets at the misfortune which resulted in the interception of Foreign Secretary Zimmermann's note, but that "responsibility for the loss" could not be placed on the German Ambassador Von Brestoff arrived from the United States.
