The names of fifty-one officers and twenty-two enlisted men, released from a German prison camp at Villingen, who passed through Switzerland November 25, on their way to France, were made public to-day by the War Department.

The armored cruiser North Carolina, first of the drifting craft to be equipped for troop transport, was ploughing the Atlantic today en way to St. Louis to bring 1,700 American soldiers home from France.

GERMAN TROOPS FLY HOME AND IN NEW ATTIRE

Vanquished Sergeant Expresses Desire of Soldiers That National Assembly Convene at Earliest Possible Moment; Premier Tells Troops Preponderance of Opponents Caused Abandonment of Struggle

Copenhagen, Dec. 12.—Berlin's welcome to the Prussian guard on Tuesday was solemn rather than triumphant, says Berlin advices. It was generally observed the troops marched under the German national colors and that the bands played "Deutschland Uber Alles" and officers and men were decorated with national rosettes of flowers and wore their iron crosses.

Many persons were injured when the vanguard of the troops passed through Brandenburg gate. Ebert responded to Army Help.

Friedrich Ebert, the premier, welcoming the soldiers, declared, it is said, that a new government had been established and that the army would be the strongest support in behalf of the troops a sergeant replied to the effect that the watch word now must be "quiet."

Among those who were wounded in the last days of the fighting in France were Major Samuel W. Fleming, who was able to continue on duty after his wounds were dressed at a field hospital.

The Hague, Dec. 12.—The former German Emperor is entitled to the right of sanctuary in Holland and, therefore, his return to Germany cannot be demanded, according to a statement made yesterday by Junker Beerendruck in the lower Chamber of Parliament during a debate on Holland.

The Premier said the government would have preferred that the former Emperor had not chosen Holland as a refuge, but that he came as a private individual after renouncing the throne, without direct or indirect notification of his intended arrival.

After renunciation of his throne, Junker Beerendruck continued, there could be no question of interment, nor could the former Emperor's return to Germany be demanded in view of the immemorial tradition of right of sanctuary.

William Hohenzollern crossed the Dutch frontier from Germany November 10. His formally issued notice of abdication was "made and signed by the Emperor in London with the imperial seal at Amerongen November 28."

Amerongen is in Holland and, therefore, the former Emperor had been in that country since the day when he formally laid down the scepter and relinquished the throne.

Private George Welter Looker, son of Mrs. Edward D. Looker, 1211 Thompson street, is reported as slightly wounded in the fighting in October. He is a member of Company I, One Hundred and Twelfth Infantry.

Other Harrisburgers whose names appear in the lists but whose relatives could not be located to-day are: Corporal James August 20th Kentucky, missing in action; Private Clarence Heckert, 1414 Penn street, wounded severely; Corporal James R. Johnson, 121 Balm street, wounded slightly; and Sergeant Albert Garrett, 326 Peffer street, wounded slightly.

Private Paul Hoerner was wounded severely in the fighting in the autumn of the armistic according to information received by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. George Hoerner, 558 Race street. Private Hoerner was shot in the stomach and right leg according to word received from an American Red Cross base hospital. His injury is not considered serious.

Private Charles W. Brown has been slightly wounded. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Brown, 1518 Curran avenue. The telegram sent to that Private Brown was wounded November 10. He has two brothers, also in the service. They are Frederick R. and Israel L. Brown.

It was learned last night that Private Paul J. Ross, of this city, who was suffering from the effects of being gassed and was also wounded in France, has been admitted to a hospital in France. The letter giving the information was written by a companion of Private Ross, Thomas J. Curry, who is attached to the Fourth Headquarters Company, Twenty-eighth Division, Boston.

It has been learned that Charles E. Wagner, 19 North Front street, Steeltown, died November 11 from wounds. He was attached to Battery F, Nineteenth Field Artillery, and was one of the first men in Steeltown to enlist. He sailed for France in May of this year after training in Texas. Several weeks before his sailing his father, Jacob M. Wagner, died.

Others from this locality whose names appear on to-day's lists are: Corporal David M. Rahauer, severely wounded; Chambersburg; Private Martin F. Clarke, wounded severely; Colonel Road Camp Hill; Private George F. Cole, wounded severely; Steeltown; Private Charles D. Gamberling, wounded severely; Columbia; Private Paul E. Thomas, wounded slightly; Columbia; Private Carl L. Deitch, killed in action, R. F. D. No. 4, Carlisle; Private Harry Lawyer Stue, killed in action, Carlisle, and Lieutenant Lester C. Shearer, wounded severely, Carlisle.
