

SCORE OF STATE MEN ARE KILLED IN WORLD WAR

Department Lists Report 5,439 in the Casualties of Battle

Washington, Dec. 14.—Twenty Pennsylvanians were killed in action of the 372 reported in the casualty lists made public to-day by the War Department. The total number of casualties in the lists is 5,439. The summary blow follows: Killed in action 372, Died of wounds 140, Died of accident and other causes 2, Died from airplane accident 2, Died from disease 104, Wounded severely 2148, Wounded (degree undetermined) 1196, Wounded slightly 383, Missing action 616.
