Changed conditions as a result of the war and the necessities of safeguarding the native industries during the reconstruction period, Senator Smoot contended to make imperative a revision of the Underwood-Simmons tariff law.

Senator Jones, of New Mexico, asked if it was expected to substitute the Payne-Aldrich law for the Underwood-Simmons act.

"It would be a godsend to the country, as compared with the one now on the statute books," Senator Smooth replied. "Yet I will say there are rates in the Payne-Aldrich law that will never be enacted again."

An inquiry was made by Senator Simmons as to whether it was thought tariff legislation should be enacted during the expected extra session early in 1919.
