

473 DEATHS ON WAR LIST FROM OVERSEAS ZONE

15 Pennsylvanians Killed in Action; 4,745 Named by Pershing

Washington, Dec. 17.—The War Department reports a total of 4,745 casualties to-day. Two hundred and thirty-nine of these were killed in action, and of this number 15 were Pennsylvanians. The summary follows:
