

13 STATE MEN KILLED IN ACTION IN OVERSEAS WAR

6,187 Names on List Made Public by the War Department

Washington, Dec. 19.—Six thousand one hundred and eighty-seven casualties are reported by the commanding general of the American Expeditionary Forces and made public today by the War Department. Of the 164 killed in action, 13 were Pennsylvanians. The summary follows:
