BRIEFS FROM THE BIG NEWS EVENTS

Boston. - Francis ("SIK") O'Laughlin, famous as an American League umpire, died at his apartment here today, after a short illness of influenza and pneumonia.

Santa Barbara. - Bernard Nadal Baker, of Baltimore, shipping expert and formerly a member of the Shipping Board, died at a hospital here today following an illness of three days.

New York. - Allan R. Hawley, president of the Aero Club of America, which has been instrumental in the development of the air mail service, says the flights to Chicago will be successful when two-motor machines are turned over to the Post Office Department.

Washington. - It was understood here today that the McAdoo recommendation for government control of railroads for a period of five years had failed to meet favor with the railroad executives of the country assembled in New York.

Honolulu. - One section of the Japanese peace delegation arrived here today en route to San Francisco, the party including Baron N. Makin, General Nara and Vice-Admiral Takahashi, leaders of the military and naval sections.
