School Board Officers **Meet With Committee** on Americanization

The Americanization committee of the Harrisburg Chamber of Com-merce met to-day at noon in the Harrisburg Club, in a conference with J. H. Bickley, supervisor of special activities of the Harrisburg school district, and R. Ross Seaman, chairman of the Americanization committee of the Dauphin county committee of national defense and ommittee of public safety.

The conference was for the purpose of extending the Americanization plan, and discussing the activities in that direction. Evening school classes and other elements of the

classes and other elements of the program were discussed with a view to extending the work.
