

### MAJESTIC BILL IS ENTERTAINING

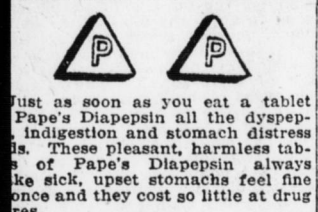
Violets' Enjoyed at Vaudeville Theater; Other Acts Please

### Dr. Fletcher, Originator of "Fletcherism," Dies

Copenhagen, Jan. 14. — Dr. Horace Fletcher, widely known as an expert on dietetics, died here yesterday of bronchitis after a long illness. Dr. Fletcher was born in Lawrence, Mass., in 1845, and was educated at Dartmouth College. Since 1885 he had been a traveler, auditor and lecturer. He carried out experiments at the University of Cambridge and Yale University, and was the originator of "Fletcherism," a system for the modification of food. He was a member of numerous health, sociological and geographical societies and the author of numerous books. During the war he was a food economist for the Commission for Relief in Belgium. Dr. Fletcher early in 1912 subsisted on a diet of potatoes for some weeks.
