

Copenhagen, Jan. 14. — Dr. Horace Fletcher, widely known as an expert on dietetics, died here yesterday of bronchitis after a long illness.

Dr. Fletcher was born in Lawrence, Mass., in 1849, and was educated at Dartmouth College. Since 1865 he had been a traveler, auditor and lecturer. He carried out experiments in the University of Cambridge and Yale University, and was the originator og "Fletcherism," a system for the mastication of food.
