Firemen and men employed on the docks of San Francisco...

London plumbers are asking that their wages be increased from 50 cents to 65 cents an hour.

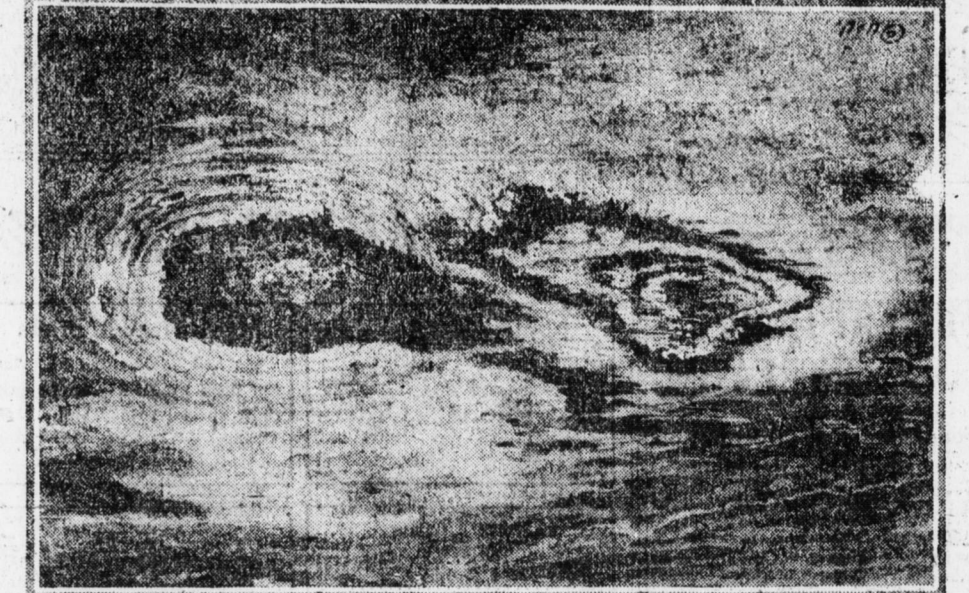
