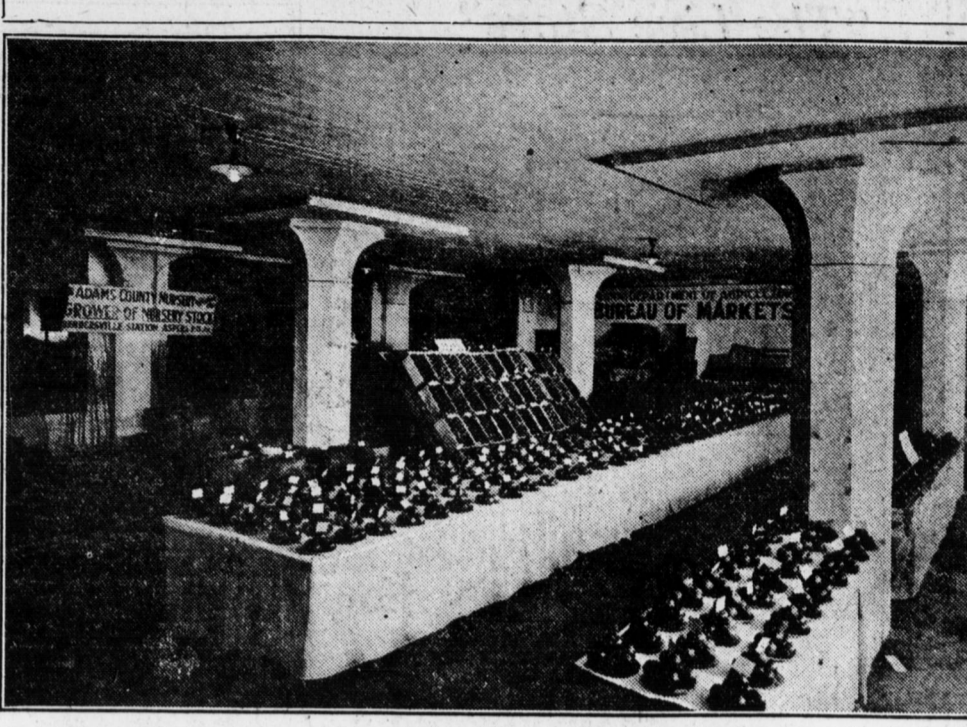
Yesterday's audiences were high in their praise of the feature entitled, "The Man Who Wouldn't Tell," playing at the Colonial for the last time.
