Baltimore, Feb. 27.—The Protestant Episcopal synod of the province of Washington met on record yesterday without a dissenting vote as endorsing the proposed league of nations and also the proclamation from Jerusalem the peace to be arranged and the calling it "the peace of Jerusalem."

No Plebiscite Needed in Alsace-Lorraine

Paris, Feb. 27.—The City Council of Colmar, Alsace, has adopted a resolution declaring that there is no need for a plebiscite in Alsace-Lorraine because the residents of those districts "were French once, are French now and intend to remain French forever."

Oppose Repeal of Daylight Saving Act

Washington, Feb. 27.—Prediction of labor leaders that a national daylight saving law making all working hours daylight hours would reduce the number of industrial accidents was borne out in the past year, said Frank Morrison, secretary of the American Federation of Labor.

Hog Policy Depends Upon Embargo Question

Washington, Feb. 27.—Decision as to the continuance of the food administration's minimum hog price policy after midnight Friday will not be made until President Wilson has determined the question of embargoes affecting neutrals and other countries.
