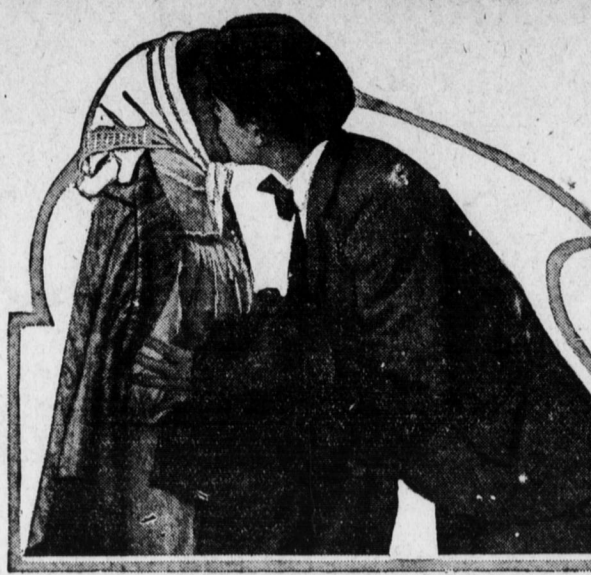

INDUSTRIALS TO GET ALLOWANCES Decision Rendered in "Short Line" Rate Case by Commission

Industrial railroads are entitled to allowances from trunk lines for picking cars for loading or unloading within the limits of the plant owned by the company of which the lines are the property when performed in connection with an interstate haul and the Pennsylvania, Baltimore and Ohio and other railroads complained of by Pittsburgh district steel companies are directed to restore the tariffs by April 1 in a decision handed down to-day by the Public Service Commission.

The decision was rendered in the cases of the National Tube Company, Carnegie Steel Company, and American Steel and Wire Company, which complained months ago against six trunk lines for refusing to pay the allowances for the services of the "short line" railroads which are owned by the manufacturing companies.

The decision, handed down by Chairman Ainsley, it is held there was no evidence that the allowances were too much or that the rates out of which they were allowed were too high. The service rendered by the terminal lines is identified with that rendered by the trunk lines to the industries in the same territory without any charge, in addition to the line haul rate, was not controlled by the Pittsburgh rate group, in which they belong, extends over 6,038 square miles and has not been questioned. The decision holds that the operation of the industrial railroads promotes economy and efficiency.

NURSE HOME FROM ITALY IS ASKED TO SERVE IN SIBERIA

Miss Marguerite Hummel Had Interesting Experience in War-Torn Europe

There has returned to her home at Steelton-329 Poplar street, in the industrial borough-Miss Marguerite Hummel, an American Red Cross nurse, who has seen much of the war-torn area of Europe during the last five months. For two months she served in Italy and had many interesting experiences among the refugees.

Within a day or two Miss Hummel had an inquiry from the Red Cross headquarters at Philadelphia as to her willingness to accompany a party of forty nurses now being organized to sail from San Francisco, March 21, for service in the Vladivostok section of Siberia.

Her trip home was not without some excitement, an interesting incident being that the guard on the train from Genoa was a little happening when the Dante Alighieri, an Italian transport, anchored at Quarantine in the outer harbor as a good joke.

Lenten Rules Read by Bishop McDevitt to Guide Members of the Diocese

The Lenten season will open Wednesday, it was publicly announced in Catholic churches of the city yesterday. It will close at noon of Holy Saturday, April 19, the day preceding Easter.

Every day in Lent, except Sunday is a fast day, on which only one full meal is allowed. A relaxation of this law permits, in the morning, a cup of tea, coffee or chocolate and two ounces of bread, and, in the evening, a partial meal not exceeding eight ounces.

Meat is forbidden on all Wednesdays, Fridays, Ember Saturday, March 15, and the forenoon of Holy Saturday.

On the days when meat is allowed, fish, oysters and other sea food may be taken with the meat.
