COPPERS TIMID IN MARKET LEAD

United States Steel and Rails Show But Little Improvement

New York, March 6.—Metals were the only important exceptions to the higher trend at the opening of to-day's stock market, coppers holding back in anticipation of dividend reductions later in the day. Advances of one to two ponts marked the early dealings in motors and subsidiaries, with Kelly-Springfield tire at a new high record. Among oils, shippings, leathers and several of the equipment issues gains extended from one to three points, but U. S. Steel and high grade rails made only fractional improvement. Profit taking, induced by the early rise, provoked temporary recessions of one to two points among oils, motors and allied specialties, but the advance made further progress before noon on renewed buying of equipments, shippings and an unusual array of miscellaneous issues. Mexican Petroleum, General Motors, Hide and Leather pfd., Marine pfd., Atlantic-Gulf, Writing Paper, pfd., Wilson Packing and Worthington Pump were the outstanding features, rising two to almost five points. U. S. Steel and Fails also made moderate extensions to their previous gains.
