

This measure, which was designed to enable Harrisburg to vote on transferring a loan of \$300,000, authorized several years ago for the Walnut street bridge, to the fund for the city's share of the memorial bridge to form part of the Capitol to all third class cities.

The bill was drawn up by Lieutenant-Governor Edward E. Beidleman and will materially facilitate the participation of the State capital in the improvements to make the State Capitol the civic center of the Commonwealth. The plan is to use the \$300,000 as a contribution toward construction of the approaches.

The Smith bill providing that county seats and counties may unite in construction of office buildings, which would carry out a suggestion by the Governor at the Chamber of Commerce dinner, is now up to the House, having passed the Senate.

Signs Other Bills

The Governor also signed the following Senate bills:

Validating elections by municipal divisions for debt increases where manifest errors occurred and which are not involved in any litigation.

Regulating debt proceedings where territory is annexed to a city or where a city is established.

Enlarging authority of masters in equity proceedings relative to dower and partition.

House bills signed included:

Increasing to \$150 amount of wages which may be paid by an employer of a decedent to legal heirs without requiring letters testamentary or of administration.

Quieting title and enabling citizens and corporations authorized to hold realty.

We are finding in our inspections throughout the state a great deal of laxity in this respect and are working hard to have such conditions remedied."

The report of the investigators outlines the stories of the fire as given by an officer of the club and by the steward. In concluding their findings, they say:

"We learned that the only fire protection at the club was a few hand fire extinguishers; that the water supply was conveyed to the club through wooden leads, which caused considerable leakage and consequently diminished the pressure of water. There seems to have been no trouble in the electric current, and from the manner of extension through pipe conduits there is no question but that the wiring was properly installed.

"This fire is one that appears necessary to classify as undetermined, with the suggestion that by reason of the apparent confinement of the fire within the partition when first discovered, and the absence of any conditions on the outside that would indicate a solution, it may have been caused by some defect in the continement."


