

AGREEMENT ON FRENCH FRONTIER IS NOW HOPEFUL

District Progress Made Yesterday Regarding the Sarre Valley

Paris, April 2.—It is stated authoritatively today after the meeting yesterday between President Wilson and the premiers that the prospects for an accord were more hopeful.

First Plan Failed

The first plan was to give France economic control of the Sarre coal fields so as to offset damage to the coal mines of Northern France.

France was not to have political control over the large German population in the Sarre Valley which would remain with Germany.

Reparations Up Again

A new phase of the question of reparations is also being presented in the proposal to avoid stating in the treaty any specific total.

Private Norman E. Thomas, whose death was reported recently while in France with the One Hundred and Third Supply Train, died as a result of a complication of diseases, following an attack of pneumonia.

Private Norman E. Thomas, who was a son of Mr. and Mrs. E. J. Thomas, 35 North Thirtieth street, was killed by defining the character of the payments over a period of years.

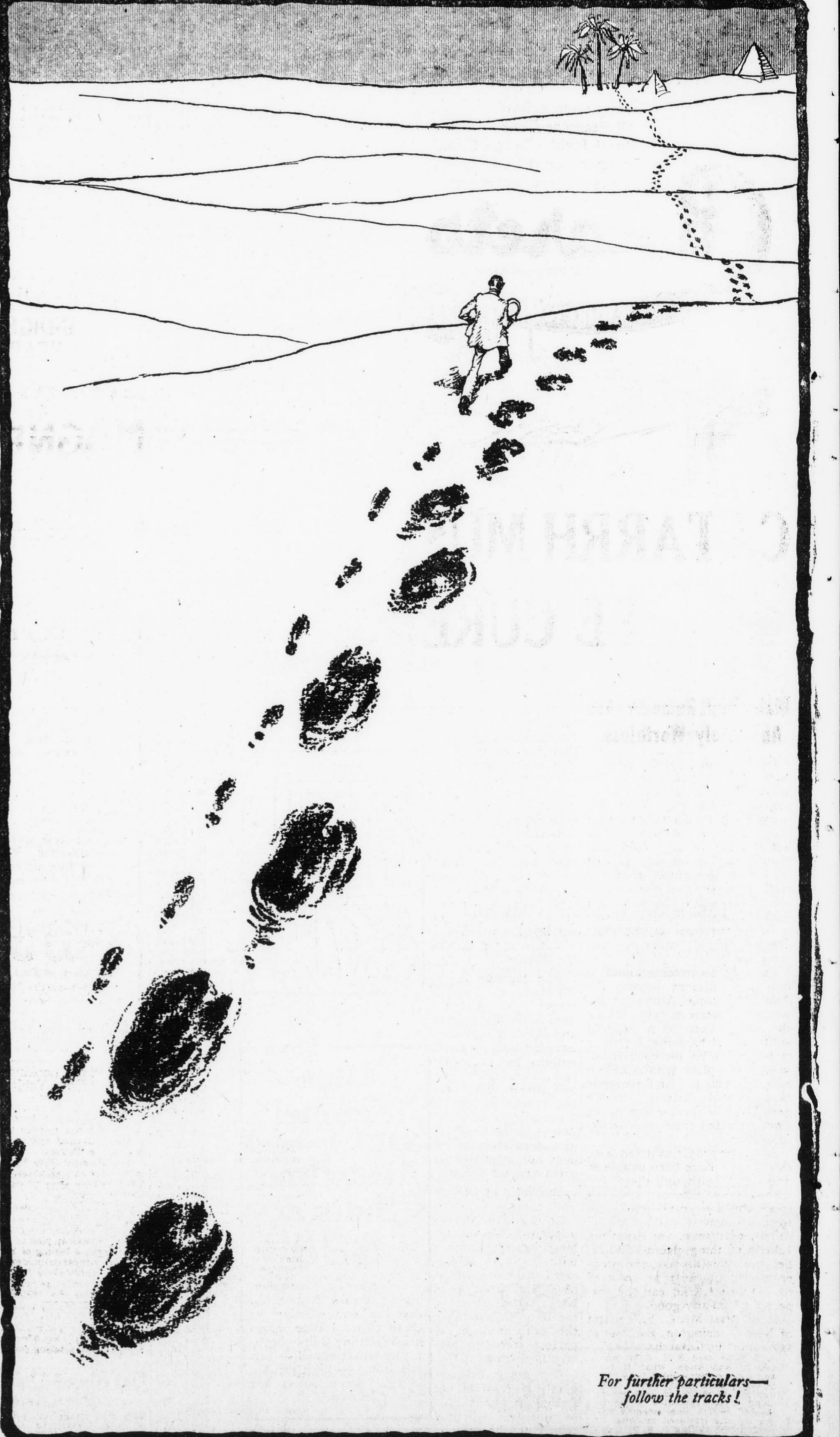
