OFFICIALS OPPOSE CHANGE IN CLARK ACT

Men Elected Under the Third Class City Law Want Legislature to Remain Inactive

Officials from a number of third class cities of the State appeared before the House Municipal Corporations Committee yesterday afternoon at a public hearing to voice their sentiments opposing the Wilson bill, which would wipe out the non-partisan features of the Clark act.

The representatives of the committee were told by the city officials that a return to partisan elections of councilmen at this time would be dangerous because of the I. W. U. and Bolshevik trouble in the industrial centers.

Extend Prison Labor

An appropriation of \$75,000 for the Prison Labor Commission is carried in a bill introduced by Mr. McGahey, Allegheny. It would provide for extension of prison industries.

Rechtold Bill Passes
