TELEPHONE COS. GET NOTICES

Attorney General Demands That Former Rates Be Restored by Them

Formal notices to telephone companies of Pennsylvania, not embraced in the act in the Dauphin county court to restrain the new rates from being put into effect that they must restore the former rates, as approved by the Public Service Commission, being issued by the Attorney General.

Attorney General William I. Schaffer, who has been issuing the notices, says that the State will require all rates for intra-State business to be under schedules approved by the Public Service Commission or the State will bring action in equity before the Dauphin county court to enforce the charges.

NATIONS' LEAGUE MAY HAVE TWO MEETING PLACES

Geneva and Brussels Are Being Considered as Possible Seats

Paris, April 4.—There is a possibility that the League of Nations will have two seats, at Geneva and at Brussels. This plan is being considered.

Although a majority of the delegates apparently favor Geneva, King Albert's strong appeal in behalf of Brussels is influencing sentiment, and the palaces offered by both the Swiss and the Belgians may both be accepted, and alternate meetings arranged.

The peace conference delegates at Budapest have received definite assurance that the new Hungarian government does not intend to apply for American aid.
