Antwerp, Belgium

Lausarae, Switzerland, Saturday, April 5. — (By the Associated Press)— Announcement that the International Olympic committee had chosen Antwerp for the Olympic games in 1920 by Baron Fierre De Coubertin, president of the committee, at a meeting here today to celebrate the twenty-fifth anniversary of the re-establishment of the Olympics, was applauded warmly. The baron said that he had sent a telegram this morning to King Albert of Belgium, announcing the decision of the committee. Neither the United States, Great Britain nor the Central powers were represented at a meeting this afternoon.

Baron De Coubertir, denied the report that the French would refuse to participate in the next Olympiad if the Germans took part. Sporting circles here doubt that the British and Americans
